

(The Diversity Committee was newly formed under the PTA this year. It is made up of parents from different cultures, working toward creating a welcoming environment for all families within the Country Parkway community.) Dear Parents/Guardians,

This month is filled with excitement, wonderment, and anticipation for children. With everyone's busy schedule, it is easy to get wrapped up in all the activity that surrounds us. Be sure to keep learning and school a priority in your home. Have a designated time for homework and reading. Also, make sure that your child is getting enough rest. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, children between the ages of 6-12 should sleep 9-12 hours per night on a regular basis to promote optimal health. Getting enough sleep improves attention, memory, general well-being, and ultimately learning! In the classroom we can see a significant difference between students who are overly tired versus students who are engaged and in tune with their teacher's instruction. Getting enough sleep is critical for student performance.

.... I am often asked, "What can I do as a parent to get my child to succeed?" I think most people who ask me that question are expecting me to answer with a grand gesture that will sky rocket their academics. (By the way, that does not even exist.) I suggest reading to your child nightly, monitoring the take-home folder and homework nightly, having dinner time as a family, getting to bed on time, and GETTING INVOLVED IN SCHOOL! What better way to get involved than to be part of the PTA. This does not entail volunteering countless hours or sending in baked goods on a regular basis. Being part of the PTA involves staying up to date with what is happening in our school and participating when you can. Email is the easiest and most simple form of communication. 

The Power of PTA: PTA Makes a Difference The

following is an excerpt from an article comparing PTAs to other unaffiliated parent organizations in schools, an article that serves to underscore the value of our PTA here at Country Parkway, as well as that of our nationwide affiliation.

The PTA Difference Founded in 1897, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) is a nationwide network of 4 million families, students, educators and community leaders working at the school building, district, state and national levels to improve education, health and safety conditions for our children. National PTA's mission is to make every child's potential a reality by engaging and empowering families and communities to advocate for all children. Over the past 120 years, PTA has helped solve some of the biggest issues facing America's children. Many of the structures all children benefit from today—child labor laws, universal kindergarten, the National School Lunch Program and the juvenile justice system were accomplished as a result of PTA members' advocacy. And it's not just at the national level. Our state and local PTAs change lives too. Florida PTA members helped to defeat a piece of state legislation that would allow for-profit management companies and other corporate interests to take over public schools, keeping children's educations from effectively being bought and sold. Washington State PTA worked to secure the passage of several major state education reforms, improving the day-to-day lives of children across the state. The impact of PTA is felt far and wide across our country. Why PTA Matters It's important to know that many of the decisions that impact children's education are not made by educators at their schools. These decisions frequently come from district, state or federal officials. According to the 2012 U.S. census, there are 114,991,725 households in the United States, but only 33,763,140 contain children of school age (age 3-18). This means that less than 30% of U.S. households have children in school—and over 70% do not. So, when issues affecting children and schools are discussed, families with children need to join forces with teachers and school administrators to be heard, because there is a good chance that the people making the decisions (politicians, school board members, community leaders, etc.) do not live with children. PTA has the ability to use our collective voice to share real-life experiences about what it is like to raise a family today—or go to school—with the critical decision-makers who may not have that perspective. If they don't live with or know about today's challenges, how can they clearly see tomorrow's solutions? PTA gives parents a united and powerful voice, a seat at the decision making table and the tools to influence change that will better the lives of all children. Unaffiliated parent groups by design do not have this type of influence on their community, region, state or at the federal level. The ability to speak for every child with one voice is the Power of PTA.


